

#### <u>Aims</u>

The aim of this policy is to maximise access to pupils' toilet facilities during the day to promote the health, well-being and learning opportunities of all learners and to provide good quality toilet facilities throughout the school.

#### **Rationale**

Ysgol Bro Caereinion recognises that well-maintained toilet facilities where learners feel comfortable and safe and have access to during the school day, are essential for health, well-being, and learning. We value and respect our learners and want them to be able to benefit from good provision and practice.

#### **Objectives**

- 1. To ensure that this policy is both accepted and upheld by the whole-school community staff, learners, governors and parents/carers
- 2. To keep toilets open and available to learners throughout the school day. Learners will be encouraged to use the toilets during breaks between lessons/activities. However, they will be given permission whenever required.
- 3. To ensure that the toilet and washroom facilities are suitable for the range of anticipated users, including learners with disabilities and special needs, with adequate lighting, fixtures and fittings.
- 4. To ensure the toilet and washroom facilities cater for the needs of all learners from ethnic and religious communities, and ensure these needs are met in a sensitive, informed and appropriate manner.
- 5. To ensure that all toilet facilities provide visual privacy for users
- 6. To ensure that all toilet areas have properly maintained supplies at all times of warm and cold water, liquid soap, hand drying facilities and toilet tissue in dispensers, provided at a convenient height.
- 7. To ensure sanitary disposal units are available to learners and areserviced on a regular basis
- 8. To implement and maintain an effective toilet cleaning, supervision and inspection regime to ensure proper standards of provision and cleanliness, throughout the school day.
- 9. To locate drinking water supplies and outlets in safe and appropriate locations, and not in toilet areas.

- 10. To actively seek the views of the whole-school community in relation to any concerns about toilet provision and access issues and to respond seriously to these and deal promptly with any problems highlighted by the learners.
- 11. To actively consult and involve the learners in managing the toilets(via the school council)
- 12. To encourage learners to respect the toilets and each other
- 13. To implement and maintain regular reviews of the policy to monitor that it is being adhered to and remains relevant.

#### **School Details**

On the Primary site, we have 6 classrooms which consist of suitable toilets and washroom facilities. We have staff toilets and two disabled toilets. All toilet facilities provide privacy for the user and have properly maintained supplies at all times of warm and cold water, soap, hand drying tissue and toilet tissue in dispensers, provided at a convenient height. Sanitary disposal is available in the staff toilets and in the Key Stage 2disabled toilet.

On the Secondary site, there are 16 girls toilets. 8 boys cubicles and 2 urinals, 10 staff toilets and 1 disabled toilet. The Leisure Centre toilets are also used when it is being used for Sports and other activities. Sanitary disposal is available in the girls toilets and staff toilets.

The toilets are monitored throughout the day and are clean. Cleaning does not take place when learners are still on premises and may be using them.

All toilets are accessible to learners throughout the school day. While learners can use toilet facilities at break and lunch times if they need to, we ensure that learners have access at all times should they need it. We recognise that toilet needs are highly individual and do not conform to regimental timetables.

We encourage learners to respect the toilets and each other's privacy. Toilets are monitored daily.

The facilities available in the school are reported annually on the governors report to parents.
