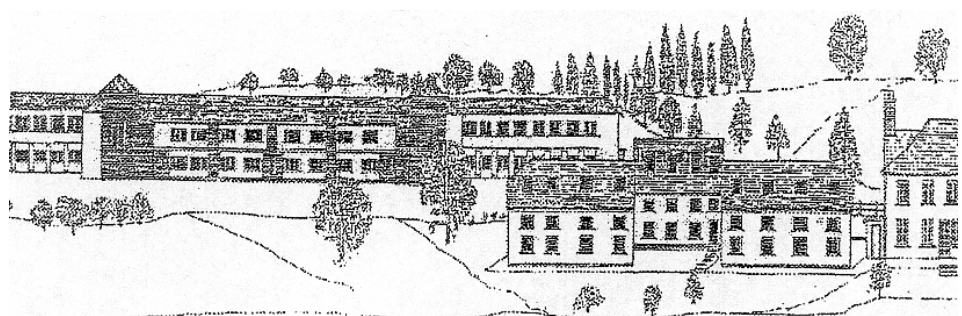
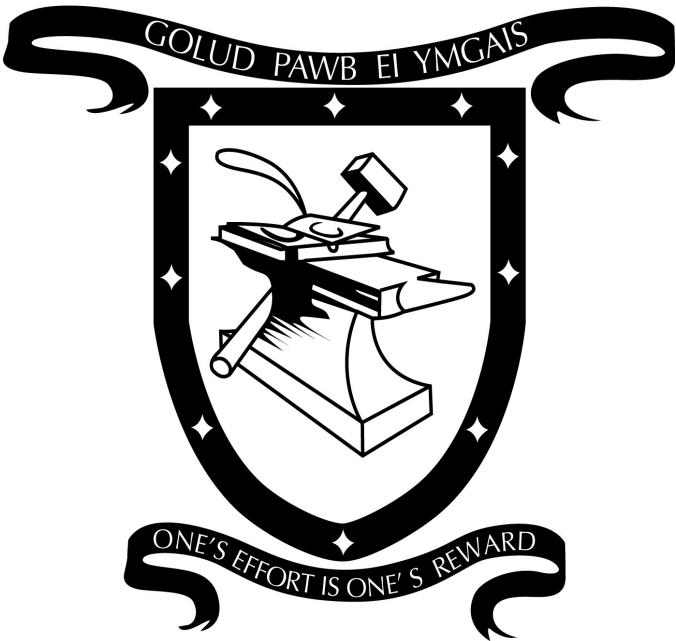

I am delighted to have been elected Chair of the Governing Body of Ysgol Uwchradd Caereinion, following the resignation of Sally Whalley in September. First and foremost, I want to extend my thanks to Sally for her hard work and commitment over the last two years.

As Chair, I now have the opportunity to introduce our new Vice Chair, Arwyn Jones, and two newly appointed governors: Vickie Griffiths and Julie Maguire.

In terms of the 2017/2018 school year, firstly there is the fantastic news that the school has now been removed from Estyn monitoring. This was due to the significant improvements made in all areas, despite there being further pressure on our budget, and having to reduce staff. My thanks go to all of the staff and governors for their efforts to achieve this.

During the last school year, a massive improvement has been made to the school IT hardware and systems, with every PC / laptop being upgraded as required, and XXXX dedicated workstations in XXX rooms being set up.

At the end of December 2018, we bid farewell to our current Head, Iona Davies. Iona is moving onto a new career and I wish her every success with her new role. Obviously, this means that we will have a new head teacher starting on 7th January. A summary of steps taken by the governing body to develop or strengthen the school's links with the community (including links with the police)

The Governing Body continues to work to strengthen its links with the communities the school serves.

We are proud to support the work the pupils do to raise funds for local initiatives and we encourage any new initiative a department might suggest, for example a plan for 2017/2018 to put on a school production/Christmas concert for the benefit of the community.

Governors have attended most parents' evenings to make themselves known and available and to ask parents to complete a questionnaire about the school. The information gained from those questionnaires was analysed to help us further understand the needs of our pupils and parents.

Members of our Governing Body continue to represent the school in their local areas and use their other interests and commitments to the benefit of the school.

We continue to recruit where necessary new governors from our wider community to reflect the bilingual nature of our school. Whilst we welcome continuity on our governing body we are also very aware of the advantage of bringing in new members.

A summary of any review and resulting action carried out by the governing body in respect of any policies or strategies adopted by them

The governing body has a rigorous policy review system whereby the Policy Review Sub-Committee follows an appropriate cycle of policy review. The clerk to the Governing Body keeps a record of this.

Policies reviewed are then presented to the full governing body for ratification.

Through the work of our sub-committees we are able to identify weaknesses in our policies and consequently more robust policies are introduced, for example, this year we identified the need for improved 'e-safety' policies and additional health and safety policies. Work on these policies will be completed during 2017/18.

A review of the school's strategic equality plan will be undertaken during 2017/18.

In addition to the regular policy review cycle, if operational use of any policy reveals weaknesses, such policies are reviewed without delay. The experiences of neighboring schools will be considered on a 'what if' basis to ensure that the policy structure underpinning practice within the school meets current needs.

A STATEMENT ON THE CURRICULUM AND ORGANISATION OF EDUCATION AND TEACHING METHODS

Teaching and Learning

Delivering a wide variety of challenging and interesting lessons within a supportive environment is at the core of our teaching and learning at Caereinion. The success in realising our curricular aims depends not only on WHAT we teach but HOW we teach. We aim to presenting information in a variety of ways, in order to provide for all kinds of learners. Not only is teaching important, but we also believe in the need to place specific emphasis on a pupil's progress within a lesson and that 'learning' is just as important, if not more important than the teaching.

Our main aim is to encourage the balanced development of the whole child.

We aim to encourage our students to be active learners and individuals who are willing to take responsibility for their own learning and embrace the concept of life long learning.

Pupils with additional Learning Needs.

The school recognises that pupils may require additional help at some time to benefit fully from the curriculum. The school favours as much integration as practically possible. Pupils with additional learning needs are afforded the same experience as their peers whilst given necessary and beneficial small group tuition or one to one support within the class with a learning support assistant.

A copy of the school's Additional Learning Needs policy is available from the school. This policy conforms fully with the ALN code of Practice.

More Able and Talented

We believe at Caereinion High School that we should provide teaching and learning opportunities which makes learning both challenging and enjoyable, with all pupils achieving their full potential by ensuring pupils receive a broad, balanced, relevant and stimulating education.

At Caereinion we endeavour to help pupils develop their skills and abilities intellectually, physically, artistically and creatively. We recognise that each one of our learners has talents and potential which we aim to identify and nurture. We recognise that there are more able and talented pupils in our school with a potential to exhibit a significantly higher level of ability across one or more areas.

We acknowledge that these pupils need rich learning experiences and high quality curriculum provision to develop, extend, give depth and enhance their abilities.

The Curriculum

Key Stage 3

During the first three years at Ysgol Caereinion the school offers a curriculum based on the National Curriculum

For Year 7 this includes: Welsh First and Second Language, English, Mathematics, Science, Technology, Information Technology, Art, Geography, History, Religious Education, French, Music, Physical Education and Games.

These subjects are usually taught in four mixed ability classes with support provided for those with additional learning needs. This support is available through the medium of Welsh and English.

In Welsh language pupils are placed into classes according to linguistic ability. Pupils who have studied Welsh as a first language at Primary school will continue with this programme at the Secondary School.

In Year 8 the same common course continues, however, the core subjects are now taught in ability groups.

In year 9 the same common course continues although important decisions have to be made regarding option choices for Year 10 and Year 11. Parents will be provided with information and the school will produce a handbook for parents and students detailing the courses and the 14-16 Learning Pathways. Key Stage 4

In Years 10 and 11 all pupils follow a core curriculum of Welsh, English, Mathematics, Science, Religious Education, Careers / PSE, Physical Education and Games. The first five subjects listed are taken to examination level. All pupils in accordance with the 14-19 Learning Pathway chose 3 other subjects from a comprehensive range of subjects.

The Welsh Baccalaureate qualification was introduced to KS4 in September 2016

Vocational courses are offered alongside GCSE courses e.g Agriculture .

All provision is detailed in the Year 10 Options Booklet, available from the school.

Key Stage 5

- Students in Year 12 and 13 are offered a wide range of Advanced Supplementary [within the Welsh Baccalaureate qualification] and Advanced [A2] subjects.
- Students are expected to follow a minimum of 4 AS subjects including the Welsh Baccalaureate.
- Students are expected to pursue 3 subjects to Advanced level.
- In accordance with the 14-19 Learning Pathway vocational courses are offered at Key Stage 5 in partnership with TRISGOL and Coleg Powys. Some of the more traditional courses are also offered in partnership with TRIGOL.
- Full details of the courses available are to be found in our Post 16 options booklet.

Students will sit regular tests and external examinations.

Year 12 and 13 students are expected to become prefects. We appreciate their mature contribution to school life.

SUMMARY OF THE PROVISION OF SPORT IN SCHOOL

The strong departmental ethos of giving one's best is paying dividends as most pupils develop their foundation skills further enabling a better performance at KS3 and KS4 by both the girls and boys. The curriculum includes health and fitness, athletics, gymnastics, hockey, netball, football, rugby, tennis, rounder's and cross – country and is continuing to grow to include boys hockey and girls football and rugby. In addition, the 5X60 officer is responsible for organizing a wide range of extra-curricular activities which are very popular and have lead on to national success.

Competitions are regularly held in the school, between schools and at County and National levels and have been a useful tool in the marketing of the school.

During 2017-18 the pupils were very successful across a range of activities, ranging from Football, Netball, Rugby, Sevens Rugby, Badminton, Squash, Athletics (Indoor, individual and team).

Currently, this allowed 13 of our teams of all ages and sexes to be North Powys or County Champions. This is extremely pleasing, highlighting that the pupils in the school access good standards of delivery, and are then able to turn this into good performances against far larger schools in the locality.

In addition to this there are a numerous individuals champions ranging from Indoor Athletics, Athletics, Wrestling and Golf.

Sport in the Community - Once again, Mr Rhys Stephens' enthusiasm and assistance to the Department has been greatly appreciated. He continues to generate enthusiasm with the pupils and activities and numbers attending activities are still very high.

Links with the Powys AYP (Active Young People) Team continue in the form of 5x60 and Dragon Sport, with the department working with them to arrange a variety of primary activities held on the school grounds.

THE USE OF THE WELSH LANGUAGE

The school's Bilingual Policy is conducive to the Powys Welsh Education Scheme

We believe strongly in linguistic continuity from primary to secondary school. In Welsh language, pupils are placed into classes according to linguistic ability. Pupils who have studied Welsh as a first language at Primary school will continue with this programme at the Secondary School.

At present a wide range of subjects are available to study through the medium of Welsh across all key stages.

All pupils entering the school aged 11 study Welsh to GCSE level. This is true of all students who transfer to Ysgol Caereinion during their school career.

Pupils entering the school from outside the area after Year 9, who have no experience of the language, are placed in a second-language class and every effort is made for them to reach an acceptable standard in the language.

The School continues to expand its academic and vocational qualifications through the medium of Welsh at KS 4 and KS5. Details are updated annually in our post 14 and post 16 option booklets. Welsh is accepted as a second language by all universities and colleges for entry purposes.

The official communication in the school is bilingual.

TOILET FACILITIES

The school recognises that well-maintained toilet facilities where pupils feel comfortable and safe and have open access to throughout the school day, are essential for health, wellbeing, and learning.

The school makes every effort to ensure well-maintained, clean, private and safe toilet facilities.

HEALTHY EATING

The School has won the 4th phase of the Healthy Schools accreditation and is now working on phase 5 and NQA creditation, which promotes whole school awareness of healthy living and physical and emotional well-being. The school works closely with the Powys Catering and the canteen to ensure that healthy meals are provided. Pupils have opportunities in School Council meetings to express an opinion about the canteen's provision and any relevant information is conveyed to the canteen staff. Parents are able to monitor what their children eat in school, as pupils' spending can be seen on-line with the new biometric system.
